VI. Plan Evaluation and Amendment

This Comprehensive School Improvement Plan will be updated annually as needed. The CSIP Strategy Committee will review the objectives and determine, using the measurements described in the plan, if progress has been made toward their achievement. The committee will also review the strategies and action items to determine if they have been implemented as described and to evaluate their effectiveness. Individuals responsible for each strategy and action item will be consulted. Based on this review of the plan, the committee may recommend amendments to the objectives, strategies, or action items. Amendments to the plan must be approved by the Board of Education. In addition, the plan may be amended if new critical issues make it necessary for the district to change the focus its resource utilization.

The superintendent, or his designee, will annually report to the Board of Education on the progress being made in achieving the plan's objectives, the implementation of the strategies and action items, and overall effectiveness of the plan.

VII. Board Approval

The Diamond R-IV School District Board of Education adopted this Comprehensive School Improvement Plan on September 8, 2005.
